

Mountview Middle School Summer Reading 2023 ~ Entering Grade 6

Middle school students entering sixth grade are required to read at least <u>one</u> book of his or her choice during the summer.

Guidelines:

- Students must choose a book they have not previously read. The book can be from the suggested summer reading list below, or students can choose another book that is new to them.
- Although no written assignment is required to be passed in at the beginning of the school year, we are providing note-taking sheets for both fiction and non-fiction books that students may find helpful to keep track of their reading. This form can be found on the Mountview website under "For Parents" and "Summer Reading and Supplies."
- Upon their return to school, students will have a brief assignment where they will share their book and they will be asked to include **direct quotations**. Therefore, it is advised that students have access to the text or fill in the note-taking sheets if this is not an option.
